




#### **STELLA**

The earliest settlers in the Stella area arrived in about 1855. An August 1881 public meeting of local farmers led to an arrangement for the Missouri Pacific Railroad to be extended to that point. Stella was platted the same year, and was named for Stella Clark, the daughter of the original owner of the town site. The track reached Stella in December 1881 and a station building was raised on January 7, 1882. The village was incorporated in 1882 and grew quickly. By fall 1882 there were 25 business firms in town. The school commenced in 1884, telephones were introduced in 1899, and an electrical system was in the planning stage in 1901.

#### **SHUBERT**

Shubert is a village in Richardson County, Nebraska, United States and was platted in 1883. The village was named for Henry W. Shubert, a pioneer settler. Its school district is Humboldt Table Rock Steinauer Public Schools. Shubert was previously in Southeast Nebraska Consolidated Schools. On January 1, 2009, it merged into the Humboldt Table Rock Steinauer School District.

#### TECUMSEH

Tecumseh is a distinctive rural community of 1800 located in Southeastern Nebraska at the intersections of State Highway 50 and U.S. Highway 136. Tecumseh was the first town in the State of Nebraska to declare a historic district in 1958. The historic town square contains many buildings which are significant architectural pieces. The Johnson County Courthouse, built in 1888, and the Tecumseh City Hall are especially impressive pieces of Romanesque, Classic Revival-style architecture. Tecumseh was the site of the first rural free mail delivery in Nebraska in 1896.



#### **CRAB ORCHARD**

Crab Orchard was platted in 1883 when the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad was extended to that point. It is a farming community located near the western border of Johnson County, just off Highway 136 east of Beatrice. Warren S. Dilworth took land where the Crab Orchard Cemetery is now located. Nearby a grove of wild crab apple trees grew, from which the village of Crab Orchard derived its name. The government established the Crab Orchard Post Office in 1864, with Dilworth as postmaster. Roy Barcroft was an American character actor famous for playing villains in B-Westerns and other genres. From 1937 to 1957, he appeared in more than 300 films for Republic Pictures. Film critic Leonard Maltin acclaimed Barcroft as "Republic Pictures' number one bad guy". Some television shows he appeared in were Gunsmoke, Lassie, Laramie, Rawhide and Bonanza.

#### **JANSEN**

Russian settler Peter Jansesn (Jansen) and a small group of 50 fellow Mennonites left Russia in 1873 and purchased 20,000 acres from the Burlington and Missouri Railroad where they established seven settlements. With word of the Chicago, Rock Island, and Pacific Railroad coming through the area, Jansen bought 80 more acres and on Aug. 20, 1886, mapped out the town. Railroad officials honored local rancher and politician Jansen by naming the new town after him. Within one year, 13 businesses had been built, including a bank. Founded by Jansen, the bank has operated continuously since that time, though it has changed leaders and names.






#### **HEBRON**

## **FRANKLIN**





## NAPONEE

Naponee is near the Republican River, about 3 miles downstream from Harlan County Dam, and about 2 miles south of U.S. Highway 136. The first settlers to the Naponee area arrived in 1869. Naponee's name originates with Napanee, Ontario, the hometown of a Canadian who fought in the Civil War and bought land along the Republican River. A post office was established in 1871 and in 1877, the first store opened and was followed by the village's first survey 1879. Railroad service arrived in 1879 with the Burlington Railroad reaching town. Incorporation of the village of Naponee took place on November 30, 1909. David Janssen, the film and television actor, was born in Naponee.

## HAIGLER

Whether traveling north on Highway 27 from Kansas or east on Highway 34 from Colorado, the first town in Nebraska is Haigler, population 230. It is the state's "cornerstone." The townsite was the homestead of James and Arabelle Porter, the first family to settle here and who built a mercantile store. The Burlington Railroad extended its lines from Indianola to Denver in 1881-82. The mail was dispatched at Jake Haigler's ranch house, two miles west, so the railroad called it "Haigler's" Station. Haigler was platted in 1886. It was named for Jacob Haigler, the pioneer settler where the mail had been dispatched






